I, Madalena L. Arellano, say:

1. I am the principal of Heath Elementary School in Baldwin Park Unified School District. I have been principal of Heath Elementary since August of 2002. Previously, I was the assistant principal of Geddes Elementary School in Baldwin Park Unified School District for the 2001-2002 school year. Prior to that, I was a Resource Teacher at Heath Elementary from the fall of 1994 to the spring of 2001. I have extensive knowledge of the students, teachers, and facilities at Heath Elementary, and am familiar with the curriculum and instructional materials provided to the students. I have personal knowledge of the facts set forth in this declaration, and if called as a witness I would and could testify competently thereto.

2. I am familiar with Heath Elementary's II/USP Action Plan which was drafted in the spring of 2000 in connection with our participation in the Immediate Intervention/Underperforming Schools Program. Heath Elementary has been an II/USP school from the fall of 2000 to the spring of 2003.

3. I am generally familiar with the <u>Williams</u> lawsuit. I am aware that plaintiffs have quoted page 26 of Reath Elementary's Action Plan in their motion for summary adjudication, which states that 40% of teachers disagreed with the statement that

- 4. In the spring of 2000, when this Action Plan was drafted, Heath Elementary had identified the need to implement a writing and grammar program to supplement our language arts instruction and was in the process of searching for appropriate textbooks and curriculum materials to purchase in these areas. At that time, Heath Elementary was also lacking teaching materials, manipulatives and other supplemental instructional materials to accompany the math textbooks. Heath Elementary did not, however, lack textbooks in core subjects for students to use in class and to take home.
- 5. Heath Elementary subsequently purchased the writing and grammar series that we needed to supplement our language arts program. Starting in the fall of 2002, every student at Heath Elementary received their own copy of a grammar and writing textbook as well as workbooks in these subjects to use in class and to take home. Also in 2001, the district purchased State-adopted math textbooks (Saxon) for each child at Heath Elementary and the school purchased the accompanying supplemental materials such as teaching aids, workbooks and manipulatives with II/USP and other funds. These purchases of supplemental instructional materials in writing, grammar and math resolved the need for additional resources identified by the teacher survey in Heath Elementary's Action Plan. Moreover, since 2001, II/USP funds and other grants have enabled Heath Elementary to purchase many other
