Declaration of Alfredo Vargas

I, Alfredo Vargas, hereby declare:

- 1. I make this declaration based on my own personal knowledge and if called to testify I could and would do so competently as follows:
- 2. I am a student at Locke High School where I am in the 9th grade. I attended Gompers Middle School from 6th until 8th grade.
- 3. In my English class we only have a class set of books and we can't take the books home. We don't have homework in my English class and I think part of the reason is because we don't have books to take home. I think I would learn more if I had a book to take home because I would have a chance to read stories before class and be able to do more work. I would also be able to study more and understand the questions better. It's hard not having books because sometimes there are things I don't understand and without a book to take home I can't check over what I've learned. Without a book I don't learn as much.
- 4. During the first semester all English classes were reading Anne Frank's Diary or another book. I know this because in my English class that I had for the first couple weeks of school we were reading Anne Frank's Diary and our teacher told us that the classes were reading one of two books. The third week of the semester I switched English classes and in my new class, we couldn't read either book because we didn't have any books.
- 5. Up until the end of October there were no books in my Algebra class. At the end of October we got a class set of books but we still didn't have books to take home for about two weeks after we got our class set. We didn't have a class set of books until the end of October because the school put together my Algebra class the first week of school because there wasn't enough room in the other Algebra classes for any more students. Because of this the school didn't have any books for my class and had to order the books the first week of class. I know this because one of our substitute teachers told us this. We had to wait to get about two more weeks after getting the class set to get the books to take home because even after ordering a class set the school didn't have enough books for all the students to take a book home. If I would've had a book in class for the first couple months of school, I think I might have learned more Algebra. If

I would've had a book to take home I think I would've learned more because I could've looked over chapters that I didn't understand at home. At the beginning of the second semester of this school year we received brand new math books because the books that we got in October were old, written on and had pages that were ripped.

- 6. In my Algebra class last semester we had a lot of substitutes. One of the substitutes told us it was because the school hadn't hired a teacher. Up until the week of September 30th we had a different substitute each week in the class. On Monday, September 30th, we got a new substitute who was supposed to be teaching for the rest of the semester but he left in the middle of October. After that substitute we got another new substitute who taught for the rest of the semester and is still teaching us. Because we had so many substitutes and didn't have books it was harder to learn.
- 7. For about the first five weeks of my Algebra class last semester we had fold up chairs and no desks. I don't know why we didn't have desks. It was hard not having desks because we didn't have anything hard to write on. We had to use folders or other books to write notes from the board. Because we had so many substitutes, didn't have books and didn't have books it was harder to learn.
- 8. There is a rat problem at Locke. While in my Algebra, ROTC and Life Skills classes. I have heard rats running around in the air conditioner vents. I have also seen rat droppings between the shelves and books and on top of the books in my English, ROTC, and Algebra classes. I have also seen rat droppings on the floor in biology. Sometimes my biology teacher gives us extra credit to sweep the floors and I have seen rat droppings while sweeping the floor.
- 9. The air conditioning in my Algebra class does not work. Sometimes it gets really hot and it makes it hard to concentrate to focus on my work because it's so hot.
- 10. There are about seven bathrooms at school but only three or four that are open. Often there are long lines for the bathrooms and I have to wait five or ten minutes to use the bathroom. There is often no toilet paper or soap. I don't like to use the bathrooms at school because they are nasty. Sometimes I have gone home to use the bathroom rather than use the

bathrooms at school because the bathrooms are so nasty.
