- I am a Plaintiff in the above-captioned action and if called to testify could and would do so competently as follows:
- I am a student at Dorsey High School and will be 2. starting the eleventh grade in September.
- There are lots of problems at Dorsey that make it 3. really hard for me to get the education I want.
- Lots of times we do not even have the basic materials we need, like books for our classes. In my ninth-grade math class, we did not have a textbook for the first month of class. For the first month, we did absolutely nothing in class and never got any homework. We did not get handouts or even work on problems on the blackboard. The teacher just sat and read the newspaper for the whole class period.
- When we did finally get the books, the teacher would take about ten minutes at the beginning of class to explain how to do one problem. Then he would tell us to start working I did not learn very much at all in that on our homework. math class.
- In my tenth-grade math class, we did not have the new textbooks for the first three weeks of class. very good teacher, but it was very hard for her to teach out of the old books we were using. They had torn pages and pages They were also hard to read that were missing altogether. because they were heavily tagged.
- The conditions at Dorsey make it hard to learn. have seen rats in the classroom a lot. In one class, the teacher set traps. Every other day the janitor would come in

8. Some of the classrooms are really cold in the winter. In my French class last winter, one of the windows did not shut. Sometimes the temperature felt like it was about 50 degrees. People would sit in the class in jackets and even gloves. The teacher brought in some space heaters, but they only helped if you were sitting right next to them. It had a hard time learning when I was wearing a cold and could only think about getting warm.

- 9. The French class was also overcrowded. For the first two weeks of the class, there were about 45 or 50 students. Only about 30 or 35 had seats, and the other 10-15 students had to stand. Eventually the teacher moved some of them out of the class. I know that some of them were able to get into her other French class, but some people had to drop French because she is the only French teacher in Track A.
- I was in a bungalow next to the Physical Education field. There was no air conditioning in the bungalow, and in the late spring the temperature got into the high 80's inside. When it's that hot, it's very uncomfortable even with the windows open. But during the spring they fertilized the field. The smell was disgusting, so we had to keep the windows closed.
 - 11. The bathrooms at Dorsey are disgusting. They are

dirty, have water on the floor, and are tagged. Generally, there is no toilet paper. If you need to go to the bathroom, you have to go to the teacher to ask for tissue or ask the nurse if you can use her bathroom. After you go to the bathroom, there is no soap and paper towels to wash up with. Some of the bathrooms don't have hot water either.

- 12. It also seems like problems do not get fixed. For example, there are two or three broken windows in the gym that have not been fixed since I started at Dorsey in ninth-grade.
- 13. I would like to be a psychologist when I am finished with school. Right now I am volunteering in a medical clinic. Education is important to me and for my future career. However, it is frustrating and depressing to try to get an education at Dorsey because so many things get in the way of my trying to learn.
