

DECLARATION OF KENNY YEE

I, KENNY YEE, hereby declare:

1. I am one of the plaintiffs in this action and if called to testify I could and would do so competently as follows:

2. I am 15 years old and a freshman at Mark Keppel High School.


3. We don't have enough useable bathrooms at school. In the main building, there are no doors on any of the eight to ten stalls in the boys' bathroom. No one uses the toilets in the main building because there are no doors. We have three toilets and two urinals in the bungalow bathroom on the lunch court. In all the bathrooms at school, the plumbing is bad. The toilets often don't flush and they get flooded. It's really sick looking and smelling in the bathrooms most of the time. I just try to avoid going to the bathroom at school.

4. Our science classes don't have enough supplies to go around. A lot of the microscopes are broken. We only have a set of microscopes for one class, but three different science classes meet at the same time. So all three classes have to share the same one set of microscopes. Also, we don't have enough pipettors, which we use to measure very small amounts of substances. Right now, a whole table of six people will share one pipettor. If equipment breaks during the year, then we have to share what's left because supplies are really limited.

5. In the main gym, the ceiling tiles fall in while people are in the gym. One day in January during basketball practice, the coaches were standing at half court and all of a sudden a big piece of the ceiling fell in front of the coaches. The ceiling piece almost hit them. There are so many big holes in the ceiling that I can see that the same thing has happened before that day.

6. We also don't have any ventilation in the main gym. We open the doors to let some air in there. Then birds fly in and leave bird droppings everywhere.
