I went to the school practically every day of the week, or I would call the principal or vice

principal on the phone to find out when they were going to provide a teacher to teach my son's

class. I asked them to do something about the situation so many times. The administrators just kept saying not to worry and that they would get a teacher for the class, but they never did. My

son is so far behind I fear he will never ever catch up. It makes me want to cry to think that they

had him at school for an entire year doing absolutely nothing, with no teacher, no books, and

with nothing for him to do.

In eighth grade my son did not have a permanent teacher until the last four months of school, from March until June. My son had no adult in front of his classroom for that entire time. The school did not provide him with a teacher, and it made me so, so angry. Again, I went up to the school to complain, but they did not find a teacher for his class until March of his eighth grade year. Fortunately, one day after about the first three or four weeks of school when teachers, Mr. Hasker, saw my my son was wandering the halls one of the other [redacted] son. When this teacher heard that my son did not have a teacher, he let my son come into his

classroom for the rest of the year until his real teacher was hired in March even though he already had a class of his own to teach. I do not know what happened to the rest of the children in my son's class from September until March.

6. My son did not receive an education at Hosler, and I am furious. No child should be treated as my child has been treated. My son is being promoted to high school, and yet he is still reading and writing at a first grade level. This school has utterly and completely failed to educate him, and I am shocked, angry, and saddened. He is just so far behind it makes me sick to my stomach. I feel hopeless because I complained often, and the school administrators did nothing to change the situation for my son, and now they are sending him on to high school without the knowledge he needs to succeed.
