It is terrible that I did not receive something as basic as a textbook in so many of my classes at

Fremont. This year I am at Life Academy and I can see the difference. I have a textbook in all of

my classes that I can take home to study with and to do my homework. It makes a big difference.

I feel like I am learning a lot more, I can review at home, and it is easier to complete my homework because I have a book at home to use.

- During the 1999-2000 school year, I did not have a permanent teacher for my physical science class for the entire school year. I had different substitutes throughout the year, and I did not learn anything in physical science. That class was terrible because we did not have a permanent instructor, no lesson plan, and often no work to do during the period. The administration recognized that we did not learn anything in that class and instead of giving us a grade for work that we were never assigned they gave all of the students in the class a P for pass.
- The bathrooms at Fremont are disgusting. There is tagging all over the place and sometimes the water does not come out of the faucet in one of the bathrooms. The administration at Fremont also locks most of the bathrooms in the school and so often I had to

search around to find a bathroom that was actually unlocked. Generally, only about two of the bathrooms are open during the day for students to use. I know that these conditions still exist because I have friends who still attend Fremont.

- 6. During the 2000-2001 school year, my science class was incredibly hot on many of the days during the last three months of school because we did not have air conditioning. Sometimes it would get so hot in the classroom that students would walk outside to get fresh air because they felt dizzy. On really hot days our teacher would let us sit outside because we just couldn't be inside the classroom.
- 7. My biology class during the 2000-2001 school year was overcrowded. In the beginning of the year the class had approximately 40 plus students in it, and the room was too small to hold those students so students would have to stand or sit on desks. There just weren't enough desks for everyone. The teacher would send students to the office so that they could transfer to another class, but at first the administration would just send the students back to our biology class because there was no other place for them to go. Later in the semester the situation improved and by April of 2001 I would say we had approximately 30 students in the class.
- 8. In my architecture class during the 1999-2000 school year there were mice in our workshop room. That was really disgusting.
- 9. Fremont does not have enough basic science materials for students to use such as beakers and telescope that are supposed to be available for us to complete science experiments. For example, there is a set of about 30 telescopes for all of the science classes and so students often have to share in large numbers.
- 10. I really hope Fremont High School will improve. It makes me sad that many of my friends still have to go to such a horrible place. The school is in terrible condition, and I do not believe I learned what I should have learned during my time at Fremont.
