2 5. There is no library at Hosler. There are some old books in our gym but I don't
3 know what they are really for. I really wish that we had a library where we could check out
4 books. I am a good student. It makes me upset that during my three years at Hosler there was
5 not a place at school where I could go to check out books to read. It makes me upset that we did
6 not have a library at my school.

7 6. The bathrooms at Hosler are really gross, and we don't have enough of them. I
8 would say there are about 1,500 children at the school and we have a total of two bathrooms, one
9 for the boys and one for the girls, that are actually open for the students to use during the school
10 day. It would get really crowded and dirty in the bathrooms because so many people had to use
11 them at once. Sometimes I had to wait in line to use the bathroom.

12 7. Many of the classrooms that I was in during my three years at Hosler did not have
13 air conditioning, and so during September, October, April, May, and June it was often very hot in
14 our classrooms. When it was hot, I got sweaty and I was very uncomfortable. It was much
15 harder for me to concentrate in class when it was hot inside my classroom. My teacher would
16 open up all of the windows and tell us to bring in water to drink on the school days when it was
17 hot. There needs to be air conditioning so that the students aren't so hot, uncomfortable, and
18 restless in class. It really affects my ability to learn when I am hot in my classroom.

19 8. I did not have computers in any of my classes during my time at Hosler Middle
20 School. There is a sixth grade computer lab but it was locked up most of the time, and so the
21 students really weren't allowed to use it. The seventh and eighth grade students do not have a
22 computer lab to use. I really wish that the administrators had provided us with computers for our
23 classrooms so that we could have typed our papers and so that we would have been able to learn
24 how to use the computers because I know that understanding how to use a computer is a very
25 important skill in this country.


