

Declaration of Erik Estrada

I, Erik Estrada, hereby declare:

- 1. I make this declaration based on my own personal knowledge and if called to testify I could and would do so competently as follows:
 - 2. I am a tenth grade student at Washington Preparatory School in Los Angeles.
- 3. Washington is a year-round multitrack school. There are three tracks, and I'm on the A track. Track A gets the AP classes and the honors classes, and the others don't have a lot of them. If you're on the B and C tracks, you can't take all of the APs you want. For example, AP chemistry isn't available on the B and C tracks. Basically, all the major AP classes aren't available unless you're on A track.
- 4. Sometimes in my classes there aren't enough books. For example, in my world history class this year, the teacher doesn't have enough books for all her students. She only has one class set. She has old sets of books, so we can take those home. But those books are outdated. We learn in class from the new books, and the teacher assigns homework from the outdated books.
