Declaration of Sandra Almaraz

- I, Sandra Almaraz, hereby declare:
- 1. I make this declaration based on my own personal knowledge and if called to testify I could and would do so competently as follows:
- 2. I am a 12th grade student at Manual Arts High School in Los Angeles. Manual Arts is a multitrack, year-round school with three tracks. I am on the A track. I am in the Magnet Program. I am 17 years old, and I have been at Manual Arts High School since the 9th grade.
- 1. In my Physics honors class this year there were nine books for a class of more than 40 students. Two months into the semester we got 11 more books so now we have 20, but we still have to share. Because there were only nine, and now are only 20, books for the whole class I do not have my own book to bring home and work on homework with. The worst part about having only nine books was that we had to work in groups where one student read from the book to the other students and then the book was passed around the group so that everyone could look at it. Because we have to work in groups like this the class moves very slowly, we have been working on the same chapter for the last two months, and we often have to review material for students who need more time and cannot keep up without their own books.
- 4. In my 10th grade European History class during the 1999-2000 school year there were only enough books for students to use in class and no one had a book to take home. History in particular is a class that requires a lot of reading and preparation from the book and I really needed to have a book to take home for that class.
- 5. Many of the books at Manual Arts are in poor condition. In my 11th grade AP U.S. History class during the 2000-2001 school year the books were really old, they had writing all over them, the bindings were broken, and pages were coming out. In 9th and 10th grade most of my books had graffiti in them and had ripped and torn pages. My friend got an assignment in her Math class this year and when she went to do the assignment she found out that those pages were missing from her book. In my 11th grade English class the books had gotten wet and were really moldy. I have seen biology books that were almost completely covered in writing. All of

- 6. I am in the Magnet Program and we have the best books and materials in the school because I talk to people in the regular program and have seen their books. I know people in the regular program who say that about half of their classes don't have enough books for everyone to have their own or that they don't even get books until the end of the semester. I know students in the regular program at Manual Arts who have books that have broken bindings, the pages are coming out, they are smelly and wrinkled because they have been wet, and have writing all over them.
- 7. When we get new books or books in good shape its like wow, that is really surprising. Not having any books, or getting books in very bad shape is really hurting my education. I am trying to go to school to learn and school is hard enough without having to deal with problems like this. I can't do as well as I could with better materials. The teachers expect less of us because we have bad materials and other students blame the materials when they aren't learning. I shouldn't have to deal with not having a book or being given books that are in horrible shape.
- 8. Manual Arts is overcrowded. There are more than 40 students in my honors Physics class this year and there were more than 40 students in my 10th grade Biology class. These two classes were so full that there weren't enough desks for everyone and kids had to sit at the lab tables during class. My friend told me that her 11th and 12th grade Spanish classes had more than 50 students in each class. She told me that kids had to sit on the floor and others offered to go borrow desks from other classrooms every day so that they could stay in the class. The hallways and stairways are so crowded in between classes that people are running into each other and sometimes I'm late to class because it is so hard to get around campus. It is very rare to see a good, regular sized class and the overcrowding has been getting worse every year. Manual Arts is not a good learning environment and is not comfortable because it is so overcrowded.
- 9. The bathrooms at Manual Arts are smelly, dirty, have wet floors, are covered in graffiti and are not cleaned. Sometimes the toilets are clogged up. This year there is only one girls bathroom open and my teacher said that was because there was no money to pay custodians

- students in the school. I am on A track and we go to school for four months, have a two month break, go back to school for four months and then have another two month break. This schedule made it much harder for me to take the Calculus, U.S. History, Chemistry and Spanish AP tests because we would only be back in class for a month and half before the test and had to really cram during that time. My AP classes meet while we are off track but it is not the same as regular school because there is no homework and it is only for four weeks, half of the break. During these off track, intersession classes the teacher has to find an empty room to teach the class in every day. In my AP U.S. history intersession class we used a different classroom almost every day and one day I couldn't even find the classroom to go to class. I had intersession classes in conference rooms and computer labs where there was no place to write and no chalkboard. Most teachers don't give work over the breaks and we have to spend the first part of the next class reviewing what we learned before, especially in math.
- In my 10th grade Biology class in the 1999-2000 school year there was a big rat in the classroom the class period before mine and so the girls sat through that class with our feet off the floor on our desks. People were screaming and scared. A couple of times a year I see dead roaches at school and in two of my classrooms we have had ant problems.
