I, Nancy Valadez, hereby declare:

- 1. I make this declaration based on my own personal knowledge and if called to testify I could and would do so competently as follows:
- 2. I am a student in the tenth grade at Fremont High School in Oakland. I have attended Fremont during the 2000-2001 and 2001-2002 school years.
- 3. During the 2000-2001 school year in my English class my teacher only had a class set of novels for all of her English classes and so none of the students in the class could take their books home with them to read. It made me very sad because we could only read the novels in class and sometimes we wouldn't even finish the books because there just wasn't enough time for us to get through them during the class period. When a student was absent and missed the reading for the day the student would fall behind because there was no real chance for he or she to read the book on their own. It just wasn't right that we couldn't review our reading after school hours or if we didn't understand what was happening in the book, go back over it again at home. It made me feel bad that the school didn't have something as basic as a novel for each of the students to take home. My current English teacher (2001-2002 school year) has found enough novels that we can actually take a book home with us, but he still tells us that there are books that he would rather have us read but that there are not enough of those books so we can't use them.
- 4. During the 2000-2001 school year, I had three different teachers for my physical science class. I was with one teacher for a few weeks and then the administrators put my entire class with another teacher. That teacher only stayed for about two months and then she left the school. Finally, we got put with our permanent teacher, but I felt that by that point our class had really missed out on a lot of work. Each new teacher would start teaching us from a different part of the book, the teachers each had different styles, and sometimes a teacher would just redo lessons that the previous teacher had taught us. I don't understand why we had so many different teachers in just one year.
 - 5. My teacher in my music class, during the 2001-2002 school year, often tells the

students how she pays for all of her supplies, music scores, and music books with her own money. I don't think it is right that the teachers have to pay for things themselves. It makes me think that they will just get frustrated and leave the school because they get paid so little and then they have to buy everything for our classes.
