



- 24 A Yes.
- 25 Q With the reading literature book, can you

describe to me the condition of the book? What does it 1 look like, the outside, what color is it? 2

A The color of the cover is green and it has a big picture in front of it.

O Generally could you describe to me the condition of the book?

A There's writing on the side of the book, some writing.

9 Q What do you mean on the side of the book? Do you mean when a book is closed --10

A Yeah, when a book is closed, and then they 11 write on the side of the pages, like that. And the 12 13 cover is -- the cover's not really in bad condition.

Q Is not really in bad condition?

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

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
