- Q. Well, in your current eleventh grade school year are there elective classes that you wanted to 10 take at Huntington Park Senior High that you were not able to take?
 - A. Yes, there were.

There were ... I chose art. I don't remember on what -- what -- how I prioritized them. And there was also a mechanics, and computer, I think basics or something. I'm not sure what the term or the name of that class is.

- 18 Q. Are -- are you saying that you wanted to 19 take an art class, a mechanics class and a computer 20 basics class?
- 21 A. Well, yeah, those are some of the choices 22 I made. Like I said before, the counselor chooses 23 which ones she could put people into.
- 24 Q. Were these classes ranked your first, 25 second and third choices?

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- 1 A. I'm not sure.
- 2 Q. Well, what elective classes are you taking 3 in the current semester?
- 4 A. Spanish. And I don't know if soccer or track and field falls under an elective. And ... I 5 6 think that's it.
- 7 O. Is Spanish a class that you wanted to take?
- 8 A. I think I did put it in one of those
- 9 because I needed it.
- 10 Q. Do you like your Spanish class?
- A. Not that much. 11
- Q. Why not? 12

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- 1 vary around the year.

Now, I think you testified that -- that students in your chemistry class are separated into groups for the purpose of doing science labs.

- A. Yeah, we're split in half. So one half splits into individual groups and they get to do the lab one day.
 - Q. One half of the class does a lab one day?
 - A. Yes.

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on.

- Q. And the other half of the class does the same lab a different day?
 - A. Yes.
- Q. Okay. How has that affected your ability to learn?
- A. Because as I said before, sometimes the labs don't just take one day, so -- so -- and he doesn't explain the labs, he only gives us a certain amount of time to ask him questions.

And it's like sometimes so many students have so many questions that he doesn't get through to answering everybody's question. And so he basically just gives -- since he has a schedule, he just gives a certain amount of time for him to

remember specifically what happened the day before, 2 and some of the labs ask for that.

- O. And you think that if a classroom were larger, it would be easier for you to keep track of what goes on in your science labs?
 - A. If it was smaller.
 - Q. If the class was -- classroom was smaller?
- A. Yes, if there weren't enough students.
- 9 Because I'm pretty sure -- I don't know how they 10 would make the classroom larger.
- Q. Has -- has a lack of space in your 12 chemistry class affected your ability to do 13 homework?
 - A. Not that I can remember.
- 15 O. Do you think that the -- a lack of space in your chemistry class has ever affected your ability 16 17 to do homework in that class?
 - A. Like lack of space as in desks, or ...
- 19 Q. I mean, I'm -- you've testified that 20 you felt that there was a lack of space in your 21 chemistry class.
 - A. Yes.
 - Q. And I want to know if that lack of space has affected your ability to do homework in chemistry.

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1 A. Can you say when I indicated that there was

2 a lack of space, or ... 3

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Q. Well, I think you testified that there was 4 not enough space in your chemistry class; is that 5 correct?

- A. Yes.
- Q. Has that affected your ability to do homework in chemistry?
- 9 A. Well, I don't think so because most of the 10 homework we do in the class, but ... I don't think 11
 - Q. Okay.
 - A. It just basically -- I think the lack of space only harms us during labs.
 - Q. Well, how much of your time in chemistry class is spent doing labs?
 - A. Well, originally it was supposed to be -because he told us that we were supposed to have at least two labs a month. But since most of the labs require a lot of supplies that he can't get for all of us, like we've -- we haven't -- like all this semester we haven't had a lab.

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do with it because, to tell you the truth, all I notice every time they fix the bathroom in the main building is they paint over the tagging.
